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Year Group Round Up



Buttercups

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Buttercups have had so much fun this half term. We went on an adventure for our WOW day of princesses and pirates. We pinned the parrot on Pete the pirate and went on a treasure hunt to find the treasure Pete had left us. We have been out in the garden a lot this term exploring and finding lots of bugs. We have started to plant

some seeds for our vegetable patch which is slowly being built.



Reception

This term the Robins and Owls have been practising their story telling skills. We have learnt the story 'What the Ladybird heard'. Please ask your child to tell you this story, we had lots of fun rehearsing it and performing it to our friends. The storytelling has helped the children to develop their writing skills. By saying what they have heard, they are now able to write what they have heard. In Computing the children are becoming more familiar with the various keys on a keyboard. During P.E the children have participated in gymnastics, learning how to jump and land safely, as well as moving in a range of ways. To finish our topic learning: 'Wiggle and Crawl' the Robins and Owls dressed up for a bug ball, showing off their favourite minibeasts. We looked for bugs, danced liked bugs and learnt lots more facts about minibeasts. The children have worked hard this term, have a wonderful and restful Easter break. Thank you for support.

<u>Year 1</u>

We have been very busy in Year 1 this term. A highlight for us was our trip to Sacrewell Farm. The children enjoyed participating in a tour of the old mill, a tractor ride and having free time to explore the different animals and parks. They were extremely well behaved and made us very proud. In Science, we have been learning about garden plants and wild plants and what they need to survive. We have planted our own green bean plants and have enjoyed watching them begin to grow. We have also conducted an experiment about whether a seed will grow with no water! We have had class pets this term in the form of caterpillars! We studied the life cycle of a caterpillar and

watched carefully to see them get bigger and bigger and transform into chrysalis! We are excited for them to become butterflies soon! In English, we have been reading Jack and the Beanstalk and have come up with some brilliant innovation ideas to create our own stories. In Music we have had fun learning how to use glockenspiels to play a tune to our 'Bread is Baking' song.





This term in our topic "Around the World in Eighty Days" we have been learning about three famous explorers, Captain Cook, Captain Scott and a recent explorer Preet Chandi. The children enjoyed learning about their expeditions and the problems they had to overcome. In Art, we have

used mixed media to create an A3 sized piece of art using bright colours to create a scene of Sydney Harbour. In English we have been learning about information texts, the pupils have written questions, researched using chrome books and created an information text about Emperor penguins. In Maths we have been learning about measurements including length, height, mass and capacity. We will be moving onto fractions and time soon. If you have a few minutes over the Easter holidays please start to teach your child about how to tell the time to o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to.



<u>Year 3</u>

Year 3 have been extremely busy this half term! They all showed amazing resilience while we were doing assessments and have been looking forward to learning all about how to write a story opening that hooks the reader in for

a sequel to a traditional tale. For Creative Mission week Year 3 have been learning about the Jewish celebration of Shabbat. We learnt what Kosher food is and why Jews eat food that is Kosher. As well as experiencing a shabbat meal on the Tuesday afternoon and designing their own table for the celebration, pupils also had fun preparing and cooking latkes (a staple food of the celebration).

Year 4

Year 4 have had a busy half term. They have enjoyed finding out more about mountains and weather, setting up their own mini weather stations to study the weather at Meadowside. In English, inspired by The Day the Crayons Quit by Drew Daywalt, they have learnt many persuasive techniques to employ when writing as different classroom objects. Maths has seen them continue to tackle fractions and Osprey have risen to the challenge of swimming. They also showed off their musical skills in their ukulele concert. We have been impressed with their enthusiasm for learning and think they definitely deserve a break. We wish you all a happy Easter.

The Year 5 children have had another busy and eventful term. In maths, they have recognised the links between decimals, percentages and fractions and in English they have written non-chronological reports about the planets, that they had already studied in science. As part of history, they have

also written reports about the Viking ships. We have finished our term by making Viking purses, which the children are very proud of.



<u>Year 6</u>

Year 6 spent a day recreating a VE Day street party menu. We baked veggie fritters and scones which we ate with cream and jam. Our spicy fritters were made from seasonal root veg and spices such as curry powder. The children had to peel, chop mash and mix using proper kitchen utensils, including sharp



knives. The excitement of the day was increased when we had a fire drill and had to abandon the studio. By five past three the last of the batches were taken from the oven and left to cool. By home time everyone had made and tasted their own cooking, to a mixed reaction! Mrs Mounir and Mrs Harding did an excellent job making sure everyone got to complete and taste their goodies.
